## Periodical Articles – In The Bibliography

### Magazine Articles

Scott, Andrea K. "Earthly Delights." *New Yorker*, December 7, 2009, 16.

**For articles found in a library database include the database and ascension number. If the article is paginated, give a page range in the bibliography.**

EXAMPLE

### Magazine Article with No Author Given

"Persons of the Year." *Time*. December 28, 2009, 12.

### Newspaper Articles

Block, Melissa. "Court Lifts Funding Ban on Stem Cell Research." *All Things Considered (NPR)*, September 9, 2010.

**For articles found online, include the URL. Include the access date only of your instructor requires it.**

### Journal Articles

**For items found in a library database add database name, and the ascension number. If the article is paginated, give a page range in the bibliography.**

## Websites, Blogs and Emails – In The Bibliography

EXAMPLE

**Because articles on the web are subject to change, provide an accessed date or last modified date.**

Google. "Google Privacy Policy." Last modified March 11, 2009. <http://www.google.com/intl/en/privacypolicy.html>.

**Email or Text Message**

Email and text messages are only listed in the footnotes, not bibliography.

## Books (Monographs, Encyclopedias, etc.) – In the Bibliography

### Book by One Author

Rowling, J. K. *Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone*. New York: A.A. Levine Books, 1998.

### Book by Two or Three Authors

Levitt, Steven D., and Stephen J. Dubner. *Freakonomics: A Rogue Economist Explores the Hidden Side of Everything*. New York: William Morrow, 2006.

### Book with Editor

Roberts, Randy, ed. *Pittsburgh Sports: Stories from the Steel City*. Pittsburgh: University of Pittsburgh Press, 2000.

### Essay in Book or Work in an Anthology

Hatch, Martin. "Popular Music in Indonesia." In *World Music, Politics and Social Change*, edited by Simon Firth, 47-67. New York: Manchester University Press, 1989.

### Entry in a Dictionary or Encyclopedia

Well-known reference works such as encyclopedias do not require publication information and are usually not included in the bibliography.

Hobbs, Jerry R. *International Encyclopedia of Communications*. New York: Oxford University Press, 1989.

### Article in a Reference Book Originally Published Elsewhere

(Examples are primary sources)

Cicero, Quintus Tullius. "Handbook on Canvassing for the Consulship." In *Rome: Late Republic and Principate*, edited by Walter Emil Kaegi Jr. and Peter White. Vol. 2 of *University of Chicago Readings in Western Civilization*, edited by John Boyer and Julius Kirshner, 33-46. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1986. Originally published in Evelyn S. Shuckburgh, trans., *The Letters of Cicero*, vol. 1 (London: George Bell & Sons, 1908).

### Book Published Electronically

Austen, Jane. *Pride and Prejudice*. New York: Penguin Classics, 2007. Kindle ed.

**For books consulted online, list the URL and access date.**

Kurland, Philip B., and Ralph Lerner, eds. *The Founders' Constitution*. Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1987. Accessed February 28, 2010. <http://press-pubs.uchicago.edu/founders/>.
