For articles found in a library database include the database and ascension number. If the article is paginated, give only page consulted in the note.

Because articles on the web are subject to change, provide an accessed date or last modified date.

Entry in a Dictionary or Encyclopedia

The abbreviation "s.v." is for the Latin *sub verbo* ("under the word"). Publication information is not necessary for common reference titles.

For dictionary's and encyclopedia's consulted online, list the URL and access date.
