BETWEEN
COMMUNITY COLLEGE OF ALLEGHENY COUNTY
AND WESTMINSTER COLLEGE**

The Community College of Allegheny County and Westminster College recognize the importance of facilitating the transfer of students from one institution to another. In an effort to insure that transfer students and indigenous students be treated on an equal basis, the Community College of Allegheny County and Westminster College enter into the following articulation agreement. This agreement has been developed according to the guidelines established by the State System of Higher Education in Pennsylvania.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT:

1. **Academic Policies:**

A student enrolled in a **University Parallel Program at The Community College of Allegheny County**, who completes all requirements for the designated **Associate in Arts or Associate in Science** degree may transfer to Westminster College and may expect the following:

1. To have the program of study at the Community College of Allegheny County reviewed and approved by the Vice President for Academic Affairs at Westminster College.
2. To have all of the courses that are approved in the program of study and which carry a passing grade accepted by Westminster College.
3. To enjoy the same rights and privileges and observe the same regulations in the major discipline as students indigenous in that discipline who are at junior level when the transfer occurs.
4. To follow Westminster College policy, which requires that the student repeat any major/support courses that carry a final grade of "C-" or lower. **The final grade for these courses must be a "C" or higher.** Students will not earn additional credits for a repeated course.
5. To have all of the courses with a passing grade accepted by Westminster College applied to the attainment of a Baccalaureate degree.

2. **Academic Stipulations:**

1. A student who wants to participate in the articulation process must contact the Transfer Counselor at the Community College of Allegheny County.
2. The student, the academic advisor, and the transfer counselor will develop a program of study following guidelines provided by Westminster College and in accordance with the curriculum established by the Community College of Allegheny County.

3. The student will review the articulation agreement and will sign a letter of intent to transfer from the Community College of Allegheny County to Westminster College.
4. The transfer counselor will send the student's program of study within thirty days after the beginning of the fall and/or spring semester to the Registrar at Westminster College.
5. The designated representative at Westminster College will review, certify and return the program of study to the transfer counselor within thirty days after receipt of the program.
6. A student may initiate changes in his/her program of study by contacting the transfer counselor at the Community College of Allegheny County who will notify the designated representative at Westminster College regarding approval of changes.
7. A student must maintain an overall average of 2.0 GPA on a four-point scale. (The Education majors are an exception and require an overall average of 3.0 GPA)
8. The Community College of Allegheny County will monitor the progress of students annually, reporting to the designated representatives at Westminster College those students who maintain eligibility.
9. A maximum of 65 credits will transfer into the College from the approved program. Any additional transfer credits will be subject to a course by course evaluation and must have a letter grade (s) of "C" or above.
10. No additional 100 and 200 level courses will be transferred into Westminster College from any institution without further evaluation.
11. Students must satisfy all other Westminster College admission requirements.
12. The attached program guide details the course equivalencies from the specified Community College of Allegheny County Programs and the specified Westminster College Programs.


3. Review of Agreement:

1. The Community College of Allegheny County and Westminster College will review this articulation agreement annually by June 30th and make adjustments or amendments when necessary.
2. This agreement may be terminated by either party providing that at least six months' advance notice of termination has been given.


