You can help us prevent sexual violence on CCAC's campus

THE FACTS

- 1 in 5 women report a sexual assault during their undergraduate collegiate experience.
- 3% of men in college report that they have been sexually assaulted in their lifetime.
- Sexual assault survivors are more likely to experience mental disorders such as depression, anxiety, and PTSD



WHO SHOULD REPORT?

All College employees, including faculty, staff and administrators, are required to report any incidences of prohibited conduct, including but not limited to sexual harassment, sexual assault, domestic violence, stalking, and discriminatory harassment.

SUPPORTIVE MEASURES

The Title IX Office can offer supportive measures upon notice of prohibited conduct. These measures may include but are not limited to:



- Academic support
- Altering work or class schedules
- Safety planning
- Contact limitations (no contact orders)
- Referral to counseling/other community service



HOW TO RESPOND TO A DISCLOSURE

Upon hearing about someone's experience of sexual assault, it's important to offer a safe and empathetic response. First, believe and validate their feelings, emphasizing that what happened was not their fault. Let them know you're here to support them and that they can share as much or as little as they feel comfortable with. Provide resources for counseling or helplines. Respect their privacy and pace, and continue to be there for them throughout their healing journey.
