

Addendum
to the
Master Articulation Agreement
by and between
Ohio University and Community College of Allegheny County

This Addendum to the Master Articulation Agreement (“Addendum”) is entered into on June 13, 2021 (the “Effective Date”) by Ohio University (“University”), with an address of Chubb Hall 120, 1 Ohio University Drive, Athens, OH 45701; and Community College of Allegheny County (“College”), with an address of 800 Allegheny Avenue, Pittsburgh, PA 15233, collectively referred to as the “Parties.”

WHEREAS, University and College entered into a Master Articulation Agreement effective June 13, 2019 (“Agreement”);

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to supplement the Agreement to allow for students of the College to be eligible for articulated course credits at University; and


WHEREAS, the terms contained in this Addendum are specific to the degree program at each institution as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual covenants contained in this Agreement, and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:


1. Degree Program(s).
 - a. College: **Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN)** (“College Degree Program”)
 - b. University: **Bachelor of Science in Nursing (Online RN to BSN)** (“University Degree Program”)
2. Term. This Addendum will commence on June 13, 2021 and terminate on June 30, 2023.
3. The University Degree Program will be delivered in the following modality(ies): Online course offerings.
4. The College Degree Program is accredited by the following accrediting body/program certification: Middle States Commission on Higher Education and Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN).
5. Designated representatives from each institution will confer annually to review this Addendum as necessary, based on curriculum changes. Articulation courses may be added or removed from the articulation table at that time.
6. This Addendum defines a pathway by which a student could articulate the College Degree Program into the University Degree Program. Due to individual student factors, including but not limited to part-time or full-time status, need for developmental coursework, scheduling and availability of courses, all students may not be able to complete the listed pathway in the time projected. This Addendum does not guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate in four years, or in two years beyond the associate degree level.

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Admission Requirements

- Applicants must be a graduate of an approved program (or its equivalent) that prepares individuals to sit for the registered nurse licensing exam (NCLEX-RN) and be a resident of one of the Ohio University authorized states. Check undergraduate admissions website or call the School of Nursing for a list of current states.
- Earned a state approved, regionally accredited associate degree or diploma program in nursing.
- Students must also have native or transfer credit for ENG 1510 to be admitted to the major.
- Combined 2.0 GPA from all prior college-level coursework.
- Official transcripts sent directly to Ohio University from all colleges and universities you have attended

Degree Requirements

To qualify for the Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree, a student must have completed all Ohio University graduation requirements. You may have met many of these requirements during your previous nursing education program. Students must earn a minimum of 30 semester credit hours of Ohio University credit and complete a minimum of 50% of the nursing course requirements at Ohio University.

Ohio University BRICKS General Education Requirements

BRICKS is Ohio University's general education program, and requirements must be fulfilled by all baccalaureate degree students. BRICKS includes a minimum of 38 credit hours across five categories: Foundations, Pillars, Arches, Bridges, and Capstone. Courses used to satisfy BRICKS requirements may be completed through Community College of Allegheny County or OHIO Online. The table below lists Community College of Allegheny County courses that have direct course equivalencies at Ohio University which meet BRICKS requirements. General education courses that may also satisfy program requirements are inside brackets.

Asterisks (*) note courses that may be completed through the ADN. 67-68 hours of the ADN are eligible to transfer pending on whether students receive a passing grade of a C- or higher.
