This articulation agreement is built on the foundation of a long-standing, professional relationship between Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania (SRU) and Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC). SRU enters into this agreement as demonstration of this relationship and of the University's commitment to providing quality educational opportunities for community college students. Based on this written agreement and the voluntary cooperative efforts of both institutions, CCAC graduates of the Associate of Science in Music will be ensured a smooth transfer and timely completion of the Bachelor of Music in Music Education program at SRU.

I. Purpose

The purpose of this written agreement is to outline the terms and conditions of the articulation between the Associate of Science in Music at CCAC and the Bachelor of Music in Music Education program at SRU. The agreement outlines the transfer policies, services provided and information available to students who have earned college credits from CCAC and plan to transfer to SRU.

II. Terms and Conditions

- A. CCAC students who have earned this articulated associate degree are guaranteed admission to SRU and to the Bachelor of Music in Music Education program, if the following conditions are met.
- B. The student has earned a 2.0 or higher cumulative GPA.
- C. The student successfully passes the SRU Music Department audition.
- D. The student is in good academic standing at all institutions attended.
- E. Transfer credit will be awarded for all completed non-developmental coursework, including those courses where a letter grade of "P" or "D" or greater was earned.
- F. Additional transfer credit will be considered for other sources of college credit, including but not limited to Prior Learning Assessment (PLA), credit by exam, Advanced Placement (AP), CLEP, military, or other.
- G. CCAC graduates of the articulated associate degree programs are guaranteed that they will enter SRU at the junior level.
- H. SRU will provide a preliminary/unofficial credit evaluation of transferable credits prior to application to the University, upon the student's request.
- I. Upon acceptance of the University's offer of admission and payment of the enrollment deposit, the student will receive an official credit evaluation of all completed and in-progress transferable credits.

J. Students who accept the University's offer of admissions prior to the beginning of the advanced registration period will be assigned an academic advisor and a registration date commensurate with SRU students who have earned the same number of credits through the previous term.

III. Responsibilities of the Parties of the Agreement

- A. SRU and CCAC will work cooperatively to support and effectively administer this articulation agreement in the best interest of the students.
- B. SRU and CCAC will regularly communicate regarding changes in transfer policies and procedures, curriculum requirements, and any other relevant issues and/or concerns.
- C. CCAC agrees to provide information to its students regarding this articulated program and all other majors and services available at SRU.
- D. The SRU Transfer Admissions staff agrees to regularly visit CCAC, virtually or on campus, to meet with students who plan to transfer to SRU.

IV. Mutual Terms and Conditions

- A. Term of Agreement. The term of this Agreement shall begin one year from the date of execution and will be reviewed as curricular changes occur at either institution.
- B. Termination of Agreement. Either party may terminate this agreement for any reason with, ninety (90) days' notice. In the event of a substantial breach, either party may terminate this agreement upon the occurrence of the breach by written notice that may be less than 90 days. In no event shall the termination of this agreement by either party take effect before the end of a then current academic term or adversely affect any student who may be participating in the agreement.
- C. Nondiscrimination. The parties agree to continue their respective policies of nondiscrimination and related procedures to insure such based on Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 in regard to sex, age, race, color, creed, national origin, Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and other applicable laws, as well as the provisions of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (as amended) and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.
- D. Compliance with Laws and Policies. The parties shall at all times under this agreement comply with all Federal, State, and local laws and respective institutional policies. To earn a Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania degree, 30 of the last 60 credits must be completed at SRU. In addition, students will take at least 50% of the credits required for the academic major from a PASSHE university. The degree-granting University may require up to a maximum of 50% of the academic major credits. This is in accordance with PASSHE's academic residency policy and related Board of Governors' policies.
- E. Interpretation of the Agreement. The laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania govern.
- F. *Modification of Agreement*. This agreement shall only be modified in writing with the same formality as the original agreement.
- G. Relationship of Parties. The relationship between the parties to this agreement to each other is that of independent contractors. The relationship of the parties to this contract to each other shall not

be construed to constitute a partnership, joint venture or any other relationship, other than that of independent contractors.

- H. Liability. Neither of the parties shall assume any liabilities to each other. As to liability to each other or death to persons, or damages to property, the parties do not waive any defense as a result of entering into this contract. This provision shall not be construed to limit the Commonwealth's rights, claims or defenses, which arise as a matter of law pursuant to any provisions of this contract. This provision shall not be construed to limit the sovereign immunity of the Commonwealth or of the State System of Higher Education.
- I. Entire Agreement. This agreement represents the entire understanding between parties. No other prior or contemporaneous oral or written understandings or promises exist in regards to this relationship.
- J. Confidentiality. The parties shall protect the confidentiality of student records as dictated by the Family Educational Records and Privacy Act (FERPA) and shall release no information absent written consent of the student unless required to do so by law or dictated by the terms of this agreement.
- K. Notification. Either institution may withdraw from the agreement upon written notification to the other participant. The CCAC Registrar's Office and the SRU Office of Undergraduate Admissions: Transfer Admissions area serve as the official points of contact for this Agreement.
- L. No Waiver. The failure to enforce or require the performance at any time of the provisions of this agreement shall in no way be construed to be a waiver of such provisions and shall not affect either the validity of this agreement or any part hereof, or the right of either party thereafter to enforce each and every provision in accordance with the terms of this agreement.
- M. Severability. All agreements and covenants contained in this agreement are severable, and in the event any of them are held to be invalid by any competent court, this agreement will be interpreted as if invalid agreements or covenants were not contained in this agreement.
- N. Authority. The parties executing this agreement represent and warrant to each other that they have the full right, power, capacity and authority to execute and deliver this agreement, and that they have duly and properly performed all acts required to authorize them to carry out this agreement and the transactions contemplated by it.

- Piano Proficiency: Music education students are expected to achieve piano proficiency by the end of Class Piano IV. Applied piano majors will follow the same proficiency schedule as the class piano students.
